NYSIM RESEARCH ACCEPTED FOR PRESENTATION AT THE AERA MEETING

A paper by a NYSIM research team has been accepted for presentation at the American Educational Research Association annual meeting in Chicago. The paper, "Hybrid Simulation for Teaching and Assessing Clinical Knowledge and Skills," is based on a study conducted on 52 senior NYUmedical student at NYSIM this past spring. One of the aims of the study was to assess the MD-ON-CALL e-learning modules, created at NYU, for the purpose of preparing students to recognize and manage difficult clinical problems frequently encountered by junior residents. The simulation scenarios, developed by Drs. Szyld and Dr. Green, involved standardized patients and nurses to assess the skills of the students. The research team, led by Dr. Adina Kalet, found that viewing the multimedia modules significantly improved students 'clinical skills including clinical reasoning. There are plans for a follow-on study this coming spring.
