Protocol Updates: As you may be aware, we've updated our protocol on how we begin all events here. We are going back to asking for the names of all faculty and learners expected, as well as expected arrival times; this should make it easy to note any late arriving students so we can route them for you:

Upon their arrival, all learners will be directed to sign in, and then wait in the lobby/lounge.

Program Coordinators will now:

Get their learners from the lobby and escort them to the starting location (i.e. CSR, CFR).

Let front desk attendant know that they are taking their learners.

Let the front desk know of any learners who are late and where to direct that person(s)

Let the front desk know the name of the late person(s)

In the confirmation email they will receive up to two weeks before the OSCE, the POCs should:

List full names of learners and faculty

Indicate the start/arrival times of each group if more than one start time

This will help us all to prevent learners walking into a space ahead of time while faculty, POCs, SPs etc., are still preparing, as well as help you have only one location to check/one trip to the lobby.
